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Excerpts

National Book Trust, India has recently published a book titled *Deeds of Gallantry* edited by Amlesh Kumar Mishra. Herein we reproduce an excerpt from the chapter titled 'Battle of Gangasagar' of the book.

During the 1971 War, 4 Corps led by Lt Gen Sagat Singh was asked to carry the eastern thrust into East Pakistan. The Corps was also expected to deny any enemy ingress into Tripura and Silchur, which shared a close border with Gangasagar town. The town included Gangasagar Railway Station, Mogra, Goal, Gangail and Triangle area.

To serve the twin purpose of protecting Tripura and facilitating the advance into East Pakistan the Corps planned to destroy the Akhaura defences by capturing the villages named Karnail Bazar, Gangasagar and Akhaura lying on the same axis. To this end the 'Operation Nutcracker' was planned.

The success of the operation largely depended on the capture of Gangasagar a strategically important town close to Kasba and Akhaura. The safety of the road Brahmanbaria-Comilla was also dependent on Gangasagar. In fact, Gangasagar was the gateway for any advance in the Eastern sector that leads to Dhaka. ...

Two Pakistani battalions, viz 12 Frontier Force and 12 Azad Kashmir were entrusted with the task of defending the town with some Razakars (East Pakistani Paramilitary troops) in support. On the Indian side 73 Mountain Brigade under Brigadier ML Tuli was entrusted the task to capture Gangasagar. But the task was not easy. The Indian forces had to move forward through open and marshy fields with no covering. These adverse conditions could easily shake the morale of any individual but the Indians chose to pick up the challenge.

As part of IV Corps the Battalion was already located in the border town of Pratapgarh on the southern outskirts of Agartala. To launch the assault, 14 Guards had to walk for five hours to reach the spot. Soon they set up roadblocks ahead of the town on all sides to bottle up the enemy. The commanding officer of 14 Guards, Lt Col VN Channa planned an unconventional attack on the town knowing that a conventional attack with artillery support may lead to higher casualties. Before launching the attack he formed a party to gather intelligence which helped him to finalise his plan. Major Ashok Kumar Tara, well known for saving the lives of the family of Sheikh Mujibur Rehman for which he was later awarded by Bangladesh Government the honour 'Friend of Bangladesh', was also a member of this party

On the basis of intelligence report the attack was launched on 3 December. Two companies of 14 Guards advanced separately to capture the railway station and to attack the built up area. They moved silently and took the enemy by surprise. But once they neared the enemy position heavy machine gun fire greeted them. It was then considered necessary to silence the MMG to protect the troops. The company commander Major Ashok Tara personally hurled a hand grenade and a Maltove cocktail (petrol bomb) at the enemy bunker and pulled out an enemy machine gun. The hand grenade lobbed in the bunker silenced the firing. Seeing the daring of the commander the whole company rushed upon the enemy. An intense hand to hand fight followed. Major Tara, who was grievously injured refused to abandon his post. He was awarded Vir Chakra.

Though the Guards encountered stiff resistance at every step they finally captured Gangasagar railway station. The defeated enemy now moved towards the built up area. ...

On the other flank, another company closed on the enemy position in built up area of Gangasagar, next to a pond. Unmindful of strong shelling, the company successfully managed to infiltrate the area. However, the enemy fire from the well fortified bunkers, located on a higher ground, inflicted many casualties on the attacking company.

At this juncture a young Lance Naik, Albert Ekka, who was with the forward assault company realised the necessity of

eliminating the murderous bunkers. He lobbed a hand grenade from the loophole of the concrete bunker, and silenced the light machine gun. Then he bayonetted two soldiers inside the bunker. In this act he was grievously injured in his neck and stomach but refused evacuation. He then climbed a wall, threw another grenade inside the bunker, and bayonetted the Pakistani soldier inside. Before succumbing to his injuries he destroyed the bunkers and opened the way for his company to move forward. He was awarded India's highest gallantry award Param Vir Chakra.

The company commander Col OP Kohli (then Captain) narrated his brave deed as follows: 'A very keen soldier, Ekka insisted on leading the file formation that proceeded along a very narrow front (the width of a railway track). I was a few feet from him when he came across a Pakistani sentry. "Kaun hay wahan (Who's there)? the sentry challenged and Ekka replied, "Tera Baap (Your father)," before charging with his bayonet,"

Gangasagar thus fell into Indian hands. The enemy withdrew to another position at Ujainisar leaving behind enormous quantity of arms and ammunition. ...

For outstanding performance in the battle of Gangasagar, 14 Guards were honoured with 1 Param Vir Chakra, 1 Vir Chakra and the Battle Honour 'Gangasagar'.
