

Hon'ble Governor of Punjab Inaugurates Amritsar Book Fair 2022



Ek Kitaab" initiative as per the National Education Policy. He added, book fairs not only make a variety of literature accessible but also provide a platform for cultural exchange and social integration.

NBT's Participation at Kolkata International Book Fair 2022

National Book Trust, India participated in the 45th International Kolkata Book Fair which was organised from 28 February to 13 March 2022 by the Publishers and Booksellers Guild, Kolkata, India.

With over 600 stalls, the fair was a melting pot for both literary and cultural activities. The theme country for this edition of the fair was Bangladesh. It was a celebration of the birth centenary

of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the golden jubilee of Bangladesh's independence.

The fair organisers also paid a special tribute to maestro Satyajit Ray on his 100th birth anniversary and to writer, artist Abanindranath Tagore. The book fair also hosted the Eighth Kolkata Literature Festival, where eminent personalities in the fields of art and literature

took part in seminars and panel discussions on contemporary issues.

Visitors to the NBT stall showed special interest in NBT's Bilingual titles along with books on Science, National Biographies and Folklore. NBT's



latest publication series India@75 was also displayed at the stall.

NBT books on Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose and other freedom fighters were received with much enthusiasm by book lovers.

The 46th edition of the book fair will be held around end-January next year and the theme country will be Spain, as informed by the organisers Publishers and Booksellers Guild.

PM-YUVA Mentorship Scheme Masterclasses

As part of the 75 years of Independence celebrations, Hon'ble Prime Minister had launched the PM-YUVA Mentorship Scheme for which NBT is the Implementing Agency. Under this scheme, 75 authors selected from across the country are being groomed through various Masterclasses by noted literary personalities. The Masterclasses are available on NBT's official YouTube channel for viewing.

Masterclass with Publisher Nitasha Devasar

The Fifth Masterclass was taken by Mentor Nitasha Devasar, Managing Director, Taylor & Francis, India. With many achievements to her credit and a successful career, she has also been the two-time president of the Association of Publishers in India (API). She is someone who is quite adept with the inner workings of the Publishing Industry in India as can be seen in her book, "Publishers On Publishing: Inside India's Book Business" and spoke to the YUVA authors about the same. The topic of her lecture was 'The Making of an Author: From Manuscript to Market'.

In her lecture, she discussed the points that an author needs to keep in mind. Nowadays, writers have a greater agency and the ability to choose what and how they wish to write, edit, publish or market their books; however, technology plays a great role in your writing, right from the research to the marketing aspect.

She emphasised that the authors should spend as much time in marketing their book as much as they spent on researching the topic.



She said that a proactive author is able to add value to their book in the production stage and gets an edge during the outreach stage as well.

The Mentor suggested the authors ask themselves a few questions before they start working on their manuscripts; what is your motivation in doing this? Who are you writing this book for? What is your competition? And last but not the least, Who is your audience? Among other valuable questions. However, she told them that the moment one says that they are writing for everyone, then their audience becomes nobody.

She concluded her lecture by talking about the importance of citing sources in one's work, taking due rights for the work and getting your manuscript critiqued and reviewed by peers and mentors. It is also important to spend time exploring by yourself, you will be able to write a good piece of literature.

She opened the stage for questions at the end of the session, where the YUVA authors were able to clarify their various doubts.

Masterclass with Author Birad Rajaram Yajnik

Shri Birad Rajaram Yajnik, an eminent author and the curator of the Mahatma Gandhi Digital Museums, was the mentor who spoke to the Yuva authors in the sixth Masterclass on the topic 'Writing a Biography in Contemporary Times'. Shri Yajnik had started his career by writing a biography of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi and started his lecture by discussing why did he select the Mahatma as his subject.

He advised the Yuva authors to select the person they admire, as their subject; someone who the world admires; and find out if there is a big market to be catered with the subject. He shared his experiences of writing his other biographies and read out a few small excerpts.

The mentor told the students the importance of deciding on a format while writing a biography and shared with them how he usually favors photo-biographies to textual biographies as visuals can be better communicated with the reader/audience.



He said that a photobiography generally has a format of about 200 images supporting around

20,000 words, with typically nine to twelve chapters.

He then said that the cover image that you use is the most important aspect of your biography as it is a way for you to communicate to the reader what they can expect on reading through the book.

Towards concluding his lecture, Shri Yajnik told the Yuva authors that once your biography's first edition is printed, you need to identify the demand of your book in different languages and need to select those languages carefully as it will affect the sales of the book in the longer run.

He ended his lecture by answering the doubts and questions raised by the Yuva authors.

Shri Yuvraj Malik, Director, NBT, was also present during the session and introduced the mentor to be an entrepreneur with great leadership abilities. He said that Shri Yajnik has been a part of the publishing field for ages and is a really good art curator.



Masterclass with Journalist Arvind Kumar Singh

The seventh Masterclass under the Prime Minister's YUVA Mentorship Scheme was taken by Senior Writer and veteran Journalist Shri Arvind Kumar Singh. He interacted with the YUVA Authors on the topic 'Locating and Using Documentaries for Research on National Movement'. Shri Arvind Kumar Singh began his journalism career with Dainik Jansatta and has been a Consultant Editor for Indian Railway. He has also been incharge of parliamentary and agricultural subjects on Raj Sabha TV since 2011.

Shri Singh began his session by congratulating the YUVA Authors on being selected for this prestigious scheme and encouraged them to optimize this opportunity.



He suggested the young authors watch the documentaries produced by the Film Division under



the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting to get the full essence of how Indian people and society behaved under colonial rule.

He said documentaries are a visual medium that accurately depict facts and realities of a particular subject or time and are thus a perfect representation of that time period. He suggested the authors watch the documentaries: The Beginning – 1857; Kaala Paani – Ek Tirth Sthal and Chandrashekhar Azad by the Film Division.

The lecture ended with the mentor opening the floor for questions and doubts from the YUVA authors.

Masterclass with Filmmaker Anil Zankar

The eighth Masterclass that was held for the YUVA authors under the Prime Minister's YUVA Mentorship Scheme was taken by Shri Anil Zankar who is an eminent Filmmaker and Film Historian with a great collection of cinematic endeavors credited to his name. The topic for this masterclass was "How to Use Cinema as a Source of Understanding National Movement". Shri Anil Zankar is a two-time recipient of the National Award for Writing and has over four decades worth of professional experience as a filmmaker, writer and academician.

Shri Zankar began his session by introducing the YUVA Authors to the three aspects of utilizing cinema to understand the national movement viz. history of events during the national movement, history of Indian cinema and the individual focus of the project.

He further elaborated on the timeline of Indian cinema in respect to the rise of the Indian National Movement. He added that the period between 1913 and 1947 of Indian cinema presents the best context of



the independence movement as 1913 was the year when the first feature film of India, Raja Harishchandra



was produced by Dadasaheb Phalke.

While shedding light on the topic, he also emphasised that one significant feature of Indian cinema is also the regional cinema available in languages other than Hindi.

For research purposes, he suggested the YUVA authors read 'Cinema and the Indian Freedom Struggle' by Gautam Kaul and 'Message Bearers' by STheodore Baskaran, both authors being learned film scholars. Apart from this, other resources include YouTube, National Film Archives of India, a repository of all articles, films, photos, and the Film Division under the Government of India are also excellent sources of information, he said.

The masterclass ended with a question answer session where the young writers were able to get their doubts cleared by the mentor.

NBT's Mobile Exhibition Van Reaches Statue of Unity, Gujarat

In its endeavour to promote books and reading habit among people and to make quality books accessible to the public at large in remote, rural and difficult areas, National Book Trust, India operates an innovative scheme of exhibition of books through mobile vans.

NBT's Narmada Pustak Parikrama was organised from 24 February to 27 March 2022. The mobile van touched all the major towns and cities on the bank of river Narmada. The tour was flagged off from Amarkantak and visited Shahdol, Jabalpur, Narshinghpur, Hoshangabad, Khandwa, Omkareshwar, Maheshwar and Alirajpur, Kewadia (Statue of Unity), Dhar, Indore, Ujjain, Dewas, ending at Bhopal.



The Narmada Pustak Parikrama reached the Statue of Unity, located in Kevadiya, Gujarat on 16 March 2022. The van was inaugurated by Shri Himanshu Parikh, Additional Collector, Statue of Unity Area Development and Tourism Governance Authority.

Praising the initiatives and various activities of NBT, Shri Parikh said that the NBT's initiative to bring affordable literature to the

readers' doorstep is commendable and will definitely be successful in creating awareness among the people about the importance of books and reading. Shri Parikh browsed through the books displayed in the van and also discussed future collaborations



between the two organisations. The possibility of translating biographies on Sardar Vallabhai Patel into 22 Indian languages and making the same available at the SoU gift shop was also discussed.

A special exhibition of NBT books on Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel was also put up in the van. Under 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat', NBT books based on the various states of India were also displayed in the van.

DID you know that the Grass Tail is the smallest Indian butterfly and that you can spot them in grass thickets but only if you observe closely? Or that the Malabar Tree Nymph has the slowest flight of all Indian butterflies? "Malabar Tree Nymph go by 'Vanadevatha' in Malayalam. Their flight is graceful. It looks like they just float in the air," says C Susanth, who has penned a book on the common butterflies of India.


Titled '100 Butterflies in India', the book by Susanth, an environmental writer and founder of birders group Warblers and Warders, is a field guide that can help a person identify butterflies. The book is his attempt to create interest among youngsters to go 'butterflying'.

"The focus of my book is nature conservation. There are about 1,505 species of butterflies in India. We have covered

100 common and introduced over 300 families of butterflies. The focus was on introducing the many categories of butterflies you will chance upon when you travel. And thereby create interest in watching, planting a butterfly garden and thereby contributing to nature conservation," says Susanth.

The book has general information about butterflies such as their features, habitat and

Skippers, White and Yellow, Punches and Judies, Blues and Brush-footed butterflies. Information about butterflies from all over India is available in the book, says Susanth.

Susanth started the work way back in 2013. It has been a long journey, he says. "The last butterflies to be snapped was from the Leh Ladakh region. The Tortoise Shell butterfly, which is the one seen at the highest altitude in Khardung La, can also be found in the book," he says.

Apart from pictures snapped by him, the book also has images shared by fellow birders of Warblers and Waders. Peter Smetacek, a butterfly expert, has rendered scientific support for the work. The book, priced at ₹325 and published by National Book Trust India, will hit the stands in April. In the first phase, only the Malayalam version will be available. The English version will be available by the end of the year.

NBT Signs MoU with Tribal Research Institute, Ranchi

National Book Trust, India (NBT) signed a MoU with Ranchi's Dr Ram Dayal Munda Tribal Welfare Research Institute, popularly known as Tribal Research Institute (TRI), to preserve three endangered tribal languages by publishing children's pictorial books in those languages.



Shri Satya Narayan Munda, former vice-chancellor, Dr SP Mukherjee University, inaugurated the workshop. "The language of a community reflects its culture, so utmost care should be taken while doing the translation of those popular pictorial books and the original words used in the target languages must be given proper attention," he said.

A three-day workshop was organised at TRI campus in Ranchi in which 15 pictorial books were translated into three tribal languages namely, Sabal, Korwa and Pahariya.
